Where are shipping container ports in New Zealand?

Shipping Container Ports handle a variety of traffic - the majority being containerized shipments. The main ports of New Zealand are in Auckland, Tauranga, Wellington, Napier, Otago and Lyttelton.

How much weight can a shipping container hold in New Zealand?

This shipping container is used for over-dimensional (out of gauge) cargo. It is available with or without sides. In New Zealand there is a general 30 tonne road weight limit for containers and their cargo combined (i.e. gross weight). If gross weight will exceed this amount, approval and additional permits may be required.

How many containers are there in New Zealand?

Combined, the ports of New Zealand have been increasing in traffic over recent years - showing an improvement from 1.41 million containers in 2010 to a massive 1.83 million containers in 2016. What is a foldable container?

Such foldable containers are compatible with the normal ISO-approved TEU or FEU and are strong enough to be placed anywhere on a shipboard stack. Any number of containers from 2 to 5, can be folded and stacked in such a way to form a regular container size for transport or storage.

New Containers: Often called "one-trip" containers, they've typically made a single journey from the manufacturing country and are in near-perfect condition.

Folding and unfolding of such containers take only ten minutes and four folded containers are connected or "bundled" together to form a single unit. These bundled single ...
